TEST YOUR DRUGS



The product you buy might not always be the drug that you expect it to be. It may contain adulterants or be mis-sold as a different drug. Drugs in circulation may also be more potent than expected, meaning you need less of them to feel the effects.

- Start with a test dose every time you get a new batch/packet.
- Reagent testing kits are available online and can give a greater understanding of what the drug
 contains, but they may not be suitable for identifying newer compounds or adulterants (unexpected
 ingredients) and can tell you nothing about purity or strength.
- Some adulterants (such as fentanyl) can be tested for using a test strip.

Visit CREW.SCOT to find out more about drug testing. You can't be 100% sure what the drug is by the way it looks, smells or tastes. Drug testing is a harm reduction strategy but it does not completely remove the risk of taking drugs.

Find out what is in YOUR drugs by using the FREE, ANONYMOUS postal testing service from WEDINOS. You don't need to provide any personal details other than your age, gender and the first part of your postcode. Don't have a fixed address? Use Crew's postcode - EH1.

How it works

- 1. Scan the QR code or visit WEDINOS.ORG and click 'sample testing'.
- 2. Print off a sample form. Don't have a printer? Ask your local service if they can print one, or visit Crew's Drop-in.
- 3. Follow the instructions to generate a 'reference code', make sure you keep the code safe or you won't get your results!
- 4. Fill in the form completely (or the sample won't be accepted).
- 5. Pop the form and drug sample (in something leakproof, like a baggie) into an envelope with a stamp on it and post it to WEDINOS.
- 6. Visit WEDINOS.ORG for your results, which will be posted after a few days later.
- 7. Decided not to take the drugs? Safely dispose of them by flushing them down the toilet or pouring them down the sink. Avoid putting baggies into public bins where possible.
- 8. Visit CREW.SCOT or speak to our staff to find out more about the drugs listed in the results.
- 9. Let friends know so they can take steps to reduce the harm of any drugs they plan to take.
